

Al in Education Map

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Research tells us students learn more when they we move them <u>from passive to interactive</u> ways of learning:

Passive

Learners receive information

Examples: Watching video, Reading article

Tutor example: Reading explanation from tutor

Active

Learner takes overt action

Examples: Highlighting, underlining, paraphrasing

Tutor example: Asking tutor a question

Constructive

Learner generates or produces something new

Examples: self-explaining, drawing concept map

Tutor example: learner giving an explanation for an answer

Interactive

Learner engages in dialogue where both sides are producing constructive responses

Examples: Debating about a justification for an answer


Tutor example: tutor and learner co-writing a story together
